With the flu season upon us, we'd like to remind you to keep your littles at home if they are feeling under the weather or showing any signs of a cold or flu. The following are some guidelines (can be found in your handbook) to follow:

When to Keep Your Child Home:

- 1. If your child has a fever or has had one during the last 24-hour period.(Call the Lab Coordinator if you're not sure what to do.)
- 2. If your child is taking an antibiotic that affects their participation.
- 3. If your child has a cold that interferes with their full participation in school activities including outdoor play.
- 4. If your child has a heavy or colored nasal discharge. (Usually indicates bacterial infection, requiring antibiotics.)
- 5. If your child has a constant cough not related to allergies.
- 6. If your child is fussy, cranky and generally not themselves.
- 7. If your child is just tired. Rest may prevent the development of serious illness.
- 8. If your child has symptoms of a possible communicable disease.

(These are usually sniffles, reddened eyes, sore throat, headache and abdominal pain, plus a fever.)



What is a 2 ½ hour commitment?

It is DIFFERENT than the housekeeping requirement. For each child enrolled, each family must sign up to do <u>two</u> housekeepings during the school year. Sign ups for housekeepings will be on your class board.

Each family is responsible for <u>one 2</u> ½ hour commitment. These are opportunities throughout the year to help out at events such as auction, the plant sale, Walk Your Block, pancake breakfast, etc. Sign ups will be posted on the fundraising board as events are planned.

A note from our Parent Ed Instructor:

Families,

I'm sure you have heard the news that the preschool will be moving over the summer to our new location just down the road. For some of us, this is an emotional time because we have spent so many years in our current building making memories as students, parents and teachers. Moving is a big task both physically and emotionally as you let go of the environment you have grown to be comfortable in and assimilate to a new and unknown place. A number of you have asked how to talk to your children about the move. Here are a few tips for preparing them.

- 1. Try not to start talking about the move until the end of the school year. Telling them the preschool is moving now will lead to confusion and uncertainty about the current year. We may be having a moving celebration or family day when you can come and say goodbye to the site. This would be a perfect time to explain the preschool is going to be in a new building with Mrs. Brown teaching their class.
- 2. Think about what emotions and comments you make about the move. If you say, "I'll be so sad if the loft/climber/swings cannot be moved", they will pick up on that worry or sadness. Instead try to make positive comments like, "I bet the new building will be fun to explore".
- 3. If they have questions about what it will be like, let them know that you will be able to see the new school before the first day of class. You can also drive by the building and point of things you like about it, "Look, there is a big area to run in the grass".
- 4. Once the move has taken place and they have seen the new set up, you can address any concerns, questions or sadness they may have about missing the old site or getting used to the new site. Change, even positive change, can be stressful but most children are resilient once they have had a chance to adjust.

On another note, I will be reevaluating the Parent Education Program in these last few months of preschool. During this time, the preschool and I will be addressing current trends in the field, the budget, parent participation and how we can best provide a quality program while meeting insurance and philosophical expectations. I will likely be sending a parent survey to allow each family a voice in how the program may change next year. We realize family life is busy and you have many commitments to balance but also believe in the idea of parent and child growing together, learning together and being part of a cooperative community. If you have thoughts on the move or the parent education structure, feel free to contact me and let me know.
